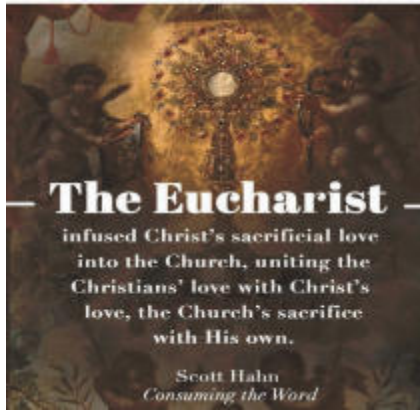
The Assumption of Mary

All the feast days of Mary mark the great mysteries of her life and her part in the work of redemption. The central mystery of her life and person is her divine motherhood, celebrated both at Christmas and a week later (Jan. 1) on the feast of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. The Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8) marks the preparation for that motherhood, so that she had the fullness of grace from the first moment of her existence, completely untouched by sin. Her whole being throbbled with divine life from the very beginning, readying her for the exalted role of the mother of the Savior.



The Assumption completes God's work in her since it was not fitting that the flesh that had given life to God Himself should ever undergo corruption. The Assumption is God's crowning of His work as Mary ends her earthly life and enters eternity. The feast turns our eyes in that direction, where we will follow when our earthly life is over.

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they do not look only to the past. They look to the present and to the future and give us an insight into our own relationship with God. The Assumption looks to eternity and gives us hope that we, too, will follow Our Lady when our life is ended.



Why Communion on the Tongue?

Some parishioners have asked why I am distributing Holy Communion on the tongue when “nobody else is doing it.” First, and most importantly, I cannot deny anyone Holy Communion on the tongue. I do not have the authority to do so because it is a right given to the faithful by the universal law of the Church. Second, it is simply not true that “nobody else is doing it.” Just because you have not seen a priest doing it proves nothing. You obviously have not been to every parish in Herkimer County, let alone the Diocese of Albany, because if you had, you would have seen plenty of other priests distributing Holy Communion on the tongue. Third, you are only required to receive Holy Communion once a year, at Easter. Therefore, if you are not comfortable receiving at this time, there is no obligation to do so and you need not come forward. Finally, I heard about this from a parishioner who was relaying it from others. In the future, if you have a question or concern, please speak directly to me instead of asking someone else to do it. **Why?** Because that is what Jesus commanded us to do: “If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone” (Mt 18:15). I do not want to hear your questions or concerns from someone else; I want to hear them from you, the one offended, because only the one who offends you can do anything about it. Doing it this way also prevents the issue from spreading to other members of the community who have no right or need to know.

Hien's Vocation Talk

For those of you who were away the weekend of July 25-26, seminarian Hien Pham spoke before Mass about how he was called to discern a vocation to the priesthood.

I would like to say thanks Father for inviting me to talk about my vocation story.

Let me introduce myself a little. I am grateful to God because I grew up in a Catholic family. My name is Joseph Hien, and my hometown is Saigon City. I was born on June 24, 1995, in a cute little house in the peaceful village of Binh Duong. There are seven people in my family and I am the third of five children. Everybody in my family said that I am a gentle, generous man. Since I was a little boy, my hobby has been remote control planes and cars. My thoughts of entering the priesthood began after I had finished two years of college. One day, while at Eucharistic Adoration, I was spending time worshipping God and I heard His call and decided to follow Him.

Because of the example set by my parents, as staunch Catholics, my call to the priesthood had begun. I remember, when I was a little boy, we prayed the Rosary daily. My parents taught me the way to worship God, how to read the Bible, as well as the catechism. I went to Mass and Holy Hour with my parents every day. My parents have helped me to develop a strong Catholic faith. I am so thankful to God for all of the things that my parents have done for me.

I want to become a priest to minister to the people. When I was young, I loved helping and participating in the many diverse activities in my parish. CHANGES TO THE BISHOP'S APPEAL

We want to let you know about a few changes to the annual campaign formerly known as the Bishop's Appeal:

The campaign will now be known as the *Diocesan Appeal* and themed, "For we walk by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5:7)

- There will no longer be "in-pew" collection of pledges.
- The 2020-2021 Diocesan Appeal will begin with a mailing sent to parishioners from the Roman Catholic Diocese of Albany (RCDA) - Office of Stewardship and Development. You should expect to receive this correspondence between now and early September; it will include a pledge card and envelope.

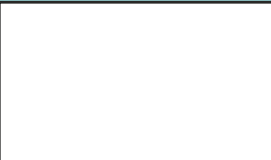
