

Proper Reception of Holy Communion

Since Sunday Masses resumed on June 14th, I have made an announcement before distributing Holy Communion. I have done this for several reasons. First, and most importantly, many have not been properly taught, or they have forgotten, how to properly receive Holy Communion. This is of the utmost importance because what we do affects what we believe. Faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is waning. We need to do all we can, therefore, to bolster people's faith in this amazing gift of Jesus' True, Flesh-and-Blood Presence among us. Second, I needed to explain how to line up along the altar rail and let you know you have the option of receiving either standing or kneeling. If you are sitting together in the pew, you may kneel/stand together at the altar rail. When you arrive at the first pew, if you are first in line, go to the far end of the altar rail where the kneeler pad begins. Do not stop half-way down. If you receive Holy Communion in the hand: 1) Remove your mask before I present the Body of Christ to you. 2) Place your hands one on top of the other, not side by side, and keep them flat. 3) Do not move your hands or your thumbs until I have moved away so as to avoid contact with my fingers. 4) Consume the host immediately; do not walk away with Jesus in your hand.

If you receive Holy Communion on the tongue, do not move your head; keep it still and wait for Jesus to come to you. It is much easier while kneeling, so if you are able, please kneel. When I approach you, close your eyes and rotate your head upwards as if you are raising your eyes to heaven. If you keep your eyes open, the tendency is to react as the host is moving toward you, which makes it harder for me to give you Holy Communion. After receiving Holy Communion, it is the ancient tradition of the Church to return to your pew and make an act of thanksgiving, i.e. a prayer of gratitude to God for blessing you with the Holy Bread of Eternal Life. Third, I wanted to remind everyone to remain in church until I process out of the sanctuary at the end of Mass.



St. Gregory the Great - Feast Day September 3rd



St. Gregory the Great was Pope from 590 to 604 and is known for his contributions to the Liturgy of the Mass. He built 6 monasteries in Sicily and founded a seventh in his home in Rome. He is one of the four great Doctors of the Latin Church and the first monk to become Pope. Despite his bodily ails and the frightful times he lived in, it has been said that no teacher of equal eminence has arisen in the Church. Gregorian Masses, which take their name from St. Gregory the Great, are a series of Holy Masses traditionally offered on 30 consecutive days as soon as possible after a persons death. they are offered for an individual soul.

be closer to God she lived her life in the seclusion of
a cave and practiced many penitential acts. In 1624,
many years after her death she appeared to a hunter
and led him to her remains. Inscribed in the walls of
the cave were the words, "I, Rosalia, daughter of
Sinibald, Lord of Roses, and Quisquina, have taken
the resolution to live in this cave for the love of my
Lord, Jesus Christ." At this time the island of Sicily
was experiencing a terrible plague, and after
parading her relics through the city, the plague
miraculously ended.




